A child without a voice is limited in their ability to make choices, interact socially, communicate basic needs and wants and, most importantly, can be closed off from the world in many ways. The ability to express one's self is paramount. Speech therapy can help a child achieve a greater ability to use and understand language, to communicate with others and to express himself or herself to the greatest extent possible.

Speech delays can create many challenges but intensive therapy has many benefits including:

- * Intelligible speech so others can understand the child

- * Increased independence

Here at the Scottish Rite Childhood Language Center, our main objective is to help children overcome barriers that may cause anxiety or frustration. Our speech-language pathologists work with children to successfully accomplish individual goals that impact communication. The end goal is to provide children with the tools to overcome any obstacle and live a fulfilled life where they feel confident in expressing their thoughts and feelings.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER Tom Varner, KCCH

As I work through the Master Craftsman program, I am continually struck and enlightened by the Biblical passages in our various Scottish Rite degrees. Lately, I have been working through the Rose Croix degrees (15-18), which are similar to the Royal Arch Mason, the Knight Templar Order of the Red Cross, and the several Knight Mason Degrees.

In all of them, they tell the story of Zerubbabel, who was a Prince of Israel in captivity in Babylonia. King Solomon's Temple had been destroyed 70 years before and the remaining Israelites had been exiled to Babylon. God spoke to King Cyrus, assisted by the prophet Daniel, and the King decreed that the Israelites could return to Jerusalem to rebuild the Temple.

Accordingly, led by Zerubbabel, Jeshua, and Haggai, the Israelites returned to the Holy Land. This story is told in the Books of Ezra and Nehemiah. But with the King's blessing, did all go well? Not at all, as the Samaritans remaining in the area constantly obstructed the Israelites and even stopped their work for a number of years until Zerubbabel appealed to King Darius for assistance, which was granted.

During that time, the Craftsman held a trowel in one hand and a sword in the other. Finally, the Second Temple was completed, and the Israelite remnant could begin their religious observances again. The 15th Degree is called the Knight of the East or the Sword or the Eagle, and the sword reference is to the weapon carried by the Craftsman while rebuilding the Temple walls.

What can we as Scottish Rite Masons take from this 2500-year-old story? As this pandemic seems to be lessening somewhat, we are going to have our own chances soon to "Rebuild our Temple". Are we ready to come out of exile? Additionally, there are any number of non-Masonic groups and people nowadays who may try to be obstructions to us. We must be prepared to work hard, strengthen our leadership, use all tools available, and defend our teachings and beliefs.

Another lesson is that God is able to work His will even through non-believers like King Cyrus and the pagan Samaritans. He is working His Will on us even through this pandemic. As it says in Romans 8:28, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." We know our purpose, to build spiritual and moral temples in the hearts of men. Let us now take up our mat and walk.
