CHAPLAIN'S CORNER Tom Varner, KCCH

In March, we will celebrate an event that changed the course of Virginia Masonic history. It was right here in the Richmond Valley that the first class of DeMolays were initiated one hundred years ago on March 25, 1922. Several months earlier, III. Herbert L. McConnell, 33°, stood up at a Valley meeting and proposed forming a DeMolay Chapter. The Valley approved and voted \$100 for the effort.

In February, a group of Advisors were selected who were a veritable who's who of Richmond Freemasonry. Joining Bro. McConnell were III. William S. Pettit, 33°, later Grand Treasurer; III. Robert D. Ford, 33°, who founded the Scottish Rite Conference and later served in the Grand Line; III. Beverly C. Lewis Jr., 33°; III. Henry G. Emrick, 33°; Maurice E. "Ebbie" Rush, KCCH; Robert M. Bullington, KCCH; and Josiah D. Hanks Jr., who later acted as Attorney General of Virginia. The Richmond Scottish Rite in subsequent years held Reunion classes to honor Bro's McConnell, Emrick, Hanks, Rush, and Ford.

On March 25, 1922, 63 young men took the vows of DeMolay, forming John Moncure Chapter. One of the new members was III. Alfred Douglas Smith Jr., 33°, who later became editor of the Masonic Herald, 1949 Grand Master of Masons, Grand Treasurer, and Executive Officer of DeMolay for 21 years. Another was III. Henry Pettit, 33°, who served as Secretary of the Richmond Valley for many years. III. Paul Welch, 33°, later joined and made many contributions to the Scottish Rite Guard.

The rich influence of DeMolay on the Richmond Scottish Rite has continued to this day. Senior DeMolays among our officers are Venerable Master Robert Eades, KCCH, Secretary Robert Carpenter, 33°, Personal Representative Sam Dunn, 33°, Past Venerable Masters Rocky Robison, 33°, and Terry Hilton, KCCH, Past Treasurer Herbert Eades, KCCH, III. Ronnie Butler, 33°, III. Charles Seward, 33°, and myself.

Our Grand Master, III. and MW James Winfield Golladay, 33°, is a Senior DeMolay and owes his membership to RW Lokie Voight, who was originally a Richmond DeMolay. Our Grand Senior Deacon, III. Matthew Szramoski, 33°, is a Senior DeMolay as are Past Grand Masters III. William T. Ellison, 33°, and III. Louis K. Campbell, 33°. I encourage all of you this spring to support DeMolay and recognize the major impact it has had on Virginia Freemasonry.
