CHAPLAIN'S CORNER Tom Varner. KCCH

After being inspired two months ago by the example of one of our Richmond Valley members who had finished reading "Morals and Dogma", I began wading through it myself. As I was reading the Secret Master Chapter, it began listing our duties as a Freemason. This reminded me of Grand Master of Masons William E. Rorer Jr., 33°, who had been one of my mentors when I was a young officer in Williamsburg Lodge No. 6. His 2010 theme was "Forget Not the Duties".

What are our duties? I first started by looking up the definition of duty, of which there are two parts: firstly, a moral or legal obligation, a responsibility; secondly, a task or action that someone is required to perform. If you think of the many Masonic obligations we have taken and our various leadership positions, we obviously have many, many duties.

Here are some duties from Albert Pike: Maintain secrecy to protect the Craft; obey the laws of God and our country; be true to every promise you make to God; be faithful to the promises you make, to the pledges you give, and to the vows that you assume to people in life; be faithful to your family and friends, to your country, and to Masonry; and be a man of honor and conscience. He expects us, by precept and example, to elevate the standard of Masonic character, to enlarge its sphere of influence, and to popularize its teachings. We are supposed to prefer our duty to everything else; be independent in our opinions; have good morals; be submissive to the laws, devoted to humanity, to our country, and to our family; kind and indulgent to our brethren; a friend of all virtuous men; and ready to assist our fellows by all means in our power.

Brother Pike summarizes it by saying he who is false to his obligations will be false to his family, his friends, his country, and his God. Those are a lot of duties to follow, for sure. But are they that far from the Ten Commandments, which serve as the bedrock for all we do?

You may remember in the 22nd Chapter of Matthew, where Jesus is asked, "Teacher, which Commandment is the greatest in the Law?" He declared, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest Commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two Commandments."

Perhaps that is all we need to remember in order to carry out our Masonic duties. If we keep God, our family, and our brethren foremost in our affections, then all will be well.


