CHAPLAIN'S CORNER Tom Varner, 32°, KCCH

One of my favorite parts of the Old Testament is when the Israelites were wandering in the wilderness. They traveled by following a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. And yet with God right there leading them, again and again, they would lose faith, begin to despair, worship false idols, reject God, and act no better than heathen. Then, Moses would pray to God, ask Him to forgive and heal his people, they would repent, and their fellowship with God would be restored. So it is with us human beings, who live imperfect lives, who sometimes turn from God, and need His assistance and guidance in acting according to His will.

Our 25th Degree, the Knight of the Brazen Serpent, memorializes one of these events. Taken from the Book of Numbers, it shows how the Israelites rebelled once again by saying "Why have you brought us up from Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we are disgusted with this miserable food." So, the Lord sent fiery serpents among the rebellious Israelites and caused them to repent their sins and ask Moses to intercede. He prayed and was told to put a fiery serpent upon a pole and that those who looked upon it, when bitten, would live. He made a serpent of brass, set it upon a pole and every person who looked on it, when bitten, was saved from death. This was also mentioned in the famous sermon in the third book of John, when Jesus makes reference to Moses lifting up the brass serpent in the wilderness. Those Israelites, who had been freed from bondage in Egypt, who were given streams of water from dry rocks and manna from heaven, demonstrated their ingratitude and lack of faith by giving up at the first sign of difficulty.

As Scottish Rite Masons, what can we learn from this degree? How does it help us grow in knowledge and wisdom? First it teaches that no matter our transgressions, God still loves us and wants to draw us to Him. As Grand Commander Henry Clausen wrote many years ago, "We stress that it is God who gives us good, freedom, love, reason, moral choice, and identity. Those are things for which we can ask and pray. It follows then that if we have faith in those basic characteristics of God, if we reflect them in our lives, and if we think those thoughts and exclude from our consciousness the opposite, we have within us an infinite, unlimited source of power." We learn from this, as well as many other Masonic degrees, that our basic purpose in life is to work and struggle to overcome our many faults, to find the spiritual nature within ourselves, to reject the evil, and to embrace the good.

Just as the Israelites eventually found their way to the Promised Land, so shall we, with God's assistance, find our way to become the men and Masons that we were mean to be. With God, all things are possible.


