throughout the boundless realms of eternity". In the Scottish Rite 18th Degree, we are taught that charity is the noblest of the three because it requires action and is therefore the chief virtue and first law of a Mason. Did you know that these words have a scriptural basis? In the King James Bible that our Masonic ritual uses, St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 13 the famous explanation of charity, ending with "And now abideth faith, hope, and charity, these three, but the greatest of these is charity."

What you may not know is that the original Greek word was agape, which King James translated in 1611 as "charity" but most modern scholars now define as "the highest form of love". Indeed, we have heard this familiar love scripture many times at weddings. Whether we choose to call it charity or love, we know that we are obligated to take concrete actions to help others. We all remember the rite of destitution in the Entered Apprentice Degree where we are required to contribute to another's relief as liberally as we can without material injury to ourselves.

Similarly, in the Royal Arch Mark Master Degree, we are taught to examine ourselves and our affairs at least three times to see if we can relieve another's necessities without the same material injury. This is one of the major ways in which Masonry differs from a mere social club; we have real obligations to help each other and our families, and these extend even beyond the grave to our widows and orphans. But even the act of giving itself carries certain obligations. Remember, just as the Lord says in the Sermon on the Mount, that when we give to charity, we should contribute in secret, and not boast about it. This requires a willing heart.

In DeMolay, the Almoner is taught that "charity, not the ostentatious and unmeaning doling out of alms is a virtue which all should practice. The cry of need is ever sounding in our ears and to it our ears must never be closed." We are approached often by destitute people; whenever that happens to me, I don't give them money, but instead buy them food and drink. Remember that in Hebrews 13, it says "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it." Let us be good stewards of what God has given us, humble about our resources and talents, and use them to the utmost to return to God what is His, and to extend agape love to our fellow men who need it.


