CHAPLAIN'S CORNER Tom Varner, 32°, KCCH

As I make my way through the Scottish Rite Degrees, I am especially interested in the 20th Degree, "Master of the Symbolic Lodge". In this degree, we learn the importance of truth, justice, and moderation, which the Master should always exemplify. The Degree teaches the duty of dispensing light and knowledge, which is similar to the Most Excellent Master Degree in the York Rite which teaches the duty of dispensing light and truth. What does it mean to dispense light and knowledge? What is the best way to do so?

We have all learned the importance of Masonic education, which is one way of dispensing light and knowledge. That is easy; we find willing listeners, develop an interesting program of instruction, and then act as a mentor in providing it. Another method of education is learned from the Five Points of Fellowship in which we are supposed to whisper good counsel to a Brother and, in the most friendly manner, advise him of his error and seek a reformation. That is not so easy. How many of us even in our families, even with our children, have difficulty in conveying important truths of right living and assist them in moving from their intended wrong path? It is just as difficult in a Masonic Lodge, where we sometimes have to speak with a Brother who is not acting in a Masonic manner, or who is not fulfilling his duties and responsibilities. It takes a measure of courage to approach a Brother, explain what he should be doing differently or better, and risk the pain of rejection or even losing a friend.

Near the end of the 20th Degree, a speaker representing Confucius invokes the Golden Rule, "Love thy neighbor as thyself. The Golden Rule is older than Jesus, older than Confucius; perhaps it was first expressed by Moses in Leviticus 19:18 over three thousand years ago. Perhaps taking the Golden Rule to heart is the best way to approach a Brother. No one likes to hear criticism; my least-favorite parts of any work year are when I receive my mid-year and year-end evaluations. But, yet, giving constructive criticism is our duty and our obligation, and if we provide it according to the Golden Rule, perhaps it will be received that way. How often do you hear of conflict within a Masonic Body when a Brother is replaced in office, and no one has talked to him beforehand about their concerns or encouraged him to try to do better? How often is a Brother engaging in conduct that is damaging the peace and harmony of a Lodge? It seems to me that if we do the hard work of using the common gavel on each other in the most loving way possible, that we may be able to make each other better. We all can improve what we do, we all have more to learn, and if we hear the proper words of truth in the moderating tones of brotherly love, we can continue to move from our rough ashlar phase toward being a perfect ashlar. Let's all give it a try!
