On June 1, 2024, in memory of III Ronnie Butler, 33°, the degrees were conferred Cinematically to 5 Brethren at MAHOVA. On October 26, 2024, in memory of Brother Samuel Richardson, KCCH, we are again anticipating conferring the degrees Cinematically to 5 Brethren again at MAHOVA.

The Conference was well attended, 250 Brethren registered to attend some portion of the Conference. Our very own, III and MW Brother Alan Adkins, 33°, SGIG was the perfect host. In October we will recognize our new 50-year members, along with our Past Venerable Masters. November will bring the Visit and reception of our newly installed 179th Grand Master of Masons in Virginia.

GRAND MASTER'S BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION



Gary Dwight Huffman was born on May 6, 1964, in Roanoke, Virginia. He graduated from Northside High School in 1982 and attended courses at Virginia Western Community College, Radford University and the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, Maryland, and hold accreditation from the Professional Career Development Institute of Atlanta, Georgia.

In July 1986, he began a career with the Roanoke County Fire and Rescue Department, where he worked his way through the ranks and served in the position of Fire Marshal for ten years prior to his retirement on June 1, 2014. During his fire service career, he attended the Law Enforcement Academy through the Virginia Department of Fire Programs and served two terms as President of the Virginia Fire Prevention Association.

Brother Huffman was raised to the sublime Degree of Master Mason on June 21, 1999, in Vinton Lodge No. 204, where he served as it's Worshipful Master in 2015. He is now a member of Lakeland Lodge No. 190 as result of a consolidation with Vinton Lodge in 2022. He is also a member of Boone Lodge No. 247.

He served as Grand Purveyor in 2011, Grand Tiler in 2015, and Administrative Assistant to the Grand Master in 2018, and was elected to the Office of Grand Junior Deacon in 2018. He is the Grand Representative to the Grand Lodge of Florida, near Virginia.

Brother Huffman is a member of the Valley of Roanoke, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite. He is a KCCH and holds membership in the Scottish Rite Research Society. He is a member of DC Shanks Royal Arch Chapter No. 31, Bayard Commandery No. 15 Knights Templar and Kazim Shrine Temple, where he has served as Captain and Secretary-Treasurer in the Provost Guard Unit. He served as Chief of the South Atlantic Shrine Association for Provost Guard Units. He served as Captain of the Mystic Pirates Unit and holds Membership in the Clifton Forge, Giles County, New River Valley and Roanoke Valley Shrine Clubs. In addition, he holds honorary membership in Acca, Oasis, Sudan, Khedive, Omar, and Hejaz Shrine Temples. He serves on the Greenville, South Carolina Shriners Hospital for Children's Hospital Board of Governors and has held the Chairman position for Building and Equipment Committee, and Human Resources Committee. He currently Chairs the Marketing and Communication Committee.

Brother Huffman is Married to the former Paula Ann Compton of Botetourt County. They live in Roanoke, Virginia and together they have two children; a daughter, Jordan Huffman Cox, Graduate of Roanoke College and a teacher, who is married to Brother Randall Hunter Cox. They have three small children and live in Salem, Virginia. Paula and Gary have a son, Brother Mason Cole Huffman, a graduate of Liberty University who is currently employed at Liberty and pursuing a Masters Degree.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER Tom Varner, 32°, KCCH

I am often called to perform Masonic funerals. When I do so, I think of our fifth degree, that of Perfect Master, in which King Solomon extolls the virtues of our beloved Grand Master Hiram Abif. Unlike the fourth degree, which is draped solemnly for mourning, the Perfect Master degree is a celebration of life. King Solomon honors the departed brother with a magnificent oration on his great abilities and skills, and how he symbolized the virtues of industry, honesty, charity, freedom, and spiritual power. These are striking lessons for us also.

In the fourth degree, we are taught the importance of performing our duty; in this degree, it expands that lesson to the importance of industry, that is to say, staying busy and doing our duty NOW. Albert Pike wrote that "Life is far too short and fleeting to waste time in idleness, follies or dissipation." The 24-inch gauge in our Entered Apprentice degree teaches us to dedicate sixteen hours each day to the service of God, the relief of a distressed worthy brother, and our usual vocations, while the beehive in the Master Mason degree teaches that we should never sit down contented while our fellow creatures are in want. Who among us can claim that we never waste time?

I think the best we can do is to know what we are supposed to accomplish, develop our plans, and work each day to advance them forward. We should be lifetime learners, constantly reading and studying to improve our knowledge and abilities. As Albert Pike wrote, "To sleep little, and to study much; to say little, and to hear and think much; to learn, that we may be able to do, and then to do, earnestly and vigorously, whatever may be required of us by duty, and by the good of our fellows, our country, and mankind,—these are the duties of every Mason who desires to imitate the Master Hiram." When our time comes to translate from this imperfect to that all-perfect celestial lodge above, we can take comfort in our belief in eternal life, that we made the most of the life we had, and that our family and friends can rejoice in and cherish the memory of, despite their sadness, the many contributions we made for their welfare.
