# **CHAPLAIN'S CORNER**

Who is my neighbor? In virtually every Masonic obligation we take, we are assured that it does not conflict with our duties to God, our country, our neighbors, or ourselves. But how often do we consider who is really our neighbor and what are our duties to him?

In a conversation in the Book of Luke, a scribe states the moral law as: 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." When the scribe then asked who was his neighbor, he was told the famous Parable of the Good Samaritan, in which a Priest and a Levite ignored a man beaten and left to die on the side of the road. However, a Samaritan stopped, bound up the man's wounds, took him to shelter, and left money to take care of him. This was an extraordinary act, for Israelites and Samaritans had been extremely hostile for centuries. When the scribe was asked who had been a neighbor to the injured man, he replied "The one who showed him mercy".

And so, as Masons, when we consider who are our neighbors, they are not just the people who live on our street, but all human beings. They are not just people of like mind or religion, but even those with whom we would not normally associate. In the closing charge, we are reminded that every human being has a claim on our kind offices, do good unto all.

We learn in the Entered Apprentice Degree that when we meet a fellow creature in like destitute condition, we should relieve his necessities as liberally as we can without material injury to ourselves. In the Entered Apprentice Charge, we are told that, by the exercise of Brotherly Love, we are taught to regard the whole human race as one family who ought to aid, support and protect each other.

In the Scottish Rite 4th Degree, we learn that one of the attributes of God is mercy, which can also be explained as kindness. And so how does Masonry set an example of mercy and kindness for our uncivil society? By showing that we can cross boundaries to show brotherly love, that we are willing to help all people, even those with whom we disagree, and that our obligations to perform these duties are real and binding. Go and do likewise!

I look forward to seeing you at any and all of our events. Thank you!


# CHAPTER OF ROSE CROIX Wise Master Robert Dalton Baird II
